definition of landscape:

“An area, as perceived by people, whose character is the result of the action and interaction of natural and/or human factors”



Landscape Partnerships

Grants from £100,000 to £3million to conserve areas of distinctive landscape character


To support schemes led by partnerships which aim to conserve areas of distinctive landscape character

The programme is acknowledged as a significant funding stream for delivering the aspirations of the European Landscape Convention in the UK

It is widely agreed that nature conservation needs to be addressed at a landscape scale

Annual budget of £20m

- the local area/community will be a better place to work, live or visit;
- environmental impacts will be reduced;
- more people and a wider range of people will have engaged with heritage.




