## Local Sites - recommended additions within Darlington borough

At the meeting of the Tees Valley Nature Partnership board/steering group on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2017 a motion was passed to ratify the following recommendations made by the Natural Assets Working Group (formerly Local Sites Partnership) of 13<sup>th</sup> December 2017.

• Inclusion of new Local Wildlife Site (LWS) Durham Tees Valley Airport Grassland GR: NZ374131. A map and description accompany this letter.

This recommendation follows evidence supplied by URS Infrastructure & Environment UK Ltd in support of a planning application to Stockton Borough Council. The criteria has been met for G1 Neutral Grasslands as set out in <u>Guidelines for the selection of Local Wildlife Sites in the Tees Valley</u>.

The Airport site is exceptional and potentially of national significance because of its size. We estimate the total site is around 100ha in size. The Joint Nature Conservancy Council in its guidance for SSSI<sup>1</sup> designation for Lowland Grasslands<sup>2</sup> in respect to neutral grasslands (of which this site is an example) recognise that "individual areas are now small in extent, seldom exceeding 10ha, and are highly fragmented". For the higher level SSSI designation "There should be a general presumption to select sites of 5ha or more...". We would therefore recommend that further surveys are conducted on the remainder of the airport site.

Natural England have been informed that the airport site was put forward for designation as a Local Wildlife Site and have been reminded of the new SSSI criteria for grassland.
