Air Pollution – What's the fuss?



- Air pollution is the greatest environmental threat to health in 2019 (World Health Organisation)
- Air pollution can severely harm your health and kill you

European and National Context

- EU Ambient Air Quality Directive (2008/50/EC)
- Local Air Quality Management Part 1V Environment Act 1995
- 25 Year Environment Plan (2018) sets out goals to achieve clean air and protect the environment
- Client Earth— 3rd High Court victory over UK governments plan to tackle air pollution
- Clean Air Strategy 2019 a tool to tackle air pollution
- UK commitment to 'net zero' greenhouse emissions by 2050

Air Pollution Matters!

- 7 million deaths worldwide (WHO, 2018)
- 28,000 to 36,000 deaths annually in UK (PHE, 2019)
- Every death attributable to air pollution is one to many!


Died in 2013 from acute respiratory failure and severe asthma


2018 report: Likely that unlawful levels of pollution detected at a monitoring station one mile from Elli's home contributed to her fatal asthma attack.

Air pollution – Wildlife, Habitat & Plant impact

- Animals inhale, ingest and absorb air pollution
- Acid deposits harm water quality, plant and soil health
- Ammonia is toxic to fish, enriches water with nutrients, leads to build up of algae and smothering of the river bed










Middlesbrough - Newport




Sulphur Dioxide hourly mean emissions






Middlesbrough - Nitrogen Dioxide




Breckon Hill Station




Redcar - Nitrogen dioxide

Redcar Dormanstown / Corporation Road







Comparison of South Tees Areas

- No distinct differences in measured background station pollutants
- Diffusion tube results vary depending on location, however results in comparable locations e.g. high traffic flow roads and fleet make up, are similar across both authorities





Challenges

- No safe level of exposure to air pollution
- Meeting an objective value is no longer the aim
- Together we can make multiple small behavioural changes in our everyday lives to help bring pollution levels down
- Together we can prevent more cases of heart disease, strokes, asthma and lung cancer





South Tees Clean Air Strategy

- Plan for Cleaner Air using policies and practices
- Raise awareness and spread positive messages
- Enforce proposed new legislation around open fires, wood burners and multi-fuel stoves
- Investigate existing pollutant sources to target future actions and interventions e.g. anti engineidling campaigns around schools
- Promote Active Travel e.g. walk, cycle etc.
- Encourage positive behavioural change and a community approach to cleaner air

- Viewpoints across Tees Valley from September 12 – 19.














