2. Planned result of the project? Max 100 words	The boardwalk would make this route accessible to all users, along with the added benefit of making the walk more pleasant for all users. A secondary motive is that, current use is churning up the ground in this area, eroding the footpath and damaging this wetland habitat. Installing a boardwalk would prevent any further damage to this habitat and allow this wetland to restore over time.
	we are looking at putting a 5m stretch of boardwalk over a boggy area of wet grassland. This will then make the meadow walk fully accessible and prevent the churning up of the wet grassland habitat by walkers. We went to 3 local companies for a quote for this work which resulted in a quote of £1000 for the 5m stretch of boardwalk from Joe Bloggs and co.
	Since our foundation in 2018, the Neighbourhood Improvement Association has planted 50m of hedge along the southern perimeter of the site, mown and planted a two-acre wildflower meadow to the northern end of the site and put up 5 community funded bench seats across the site. As part of our ongoing plan to make the site more accessible
