Lashley <u>Climate Action</u> <u>North</u>	 Rewilding Network Climate Action North is a CIC run by three directors including Sharon. Originally Climate Action North East, they have expanded to cover the north. Their projects include rewilding and pollinator parks. They will start the WATAR project which is a closed loop recycling project. They collaborate with many other projects and are part of the rewilding north – they want to be the go-to place for rewilding advice. Also working with a school to have solar powered train carriage libraries. They recognise that natural solutions aren't the whole answer and that reductions in emissions are also needed. Great Crested Newt Licencing	 Currently every time a development comes up they locate GCN ponds, build compensation ponds to move them into. These ponds aren't managed and you end up with no newts. The new method is that work is done beforehand – all likely sites are assessed and mapped. If any developments want to build there they pay towards compensation ponds on other sites. This must be on a 2:1 basis (2 ponds for every 1 destroyed). Newts aren't relocated instead ponds are colonised naturally This method has worked well on trial sites
